

Girl Scout Jeopardy – Used in the Cadette Challenge to learn about Girl Scouting

How we played: I taped the category names across the top of a poster board. Then I taped the sealed envelopes cut in half (making a “pocket”) to hold index cards that had the "answers" face down and upside down under each category. The envelope halves were numbered 100 through 500. Then, when someone chose "Juliette Low for 400", I would pull the index card out of the pocket and read the answer. The “question” was written on the back of the index cards. The person who answered correctly got to pick the next category/answer..

Girl Scout Jeopardy Questions and Answers

Juliette Low

1. Daisy (What is Juliette Low's nickname?) This was hard because they forgot what the category was and kept trying to tell me "the youngest level of Girl Scouts."
2. Halloween (When is Juliette Low's birthday?)
3. Juliette Low was born here. (What is Savannah, Georgia?)
4. March 12, 1912 (When was the first Girl Scout meeting in the U.S.?)
5. Sir Robert Baden Powell (Lord in 1929) & Miss Agnes Baden-Powell (Who introduced Juliette Low to the Girl Guide idea?)

Promise & Law

1. The number of parts in the Promise (What is 3?)
2. The number of Laws (What is 10?)
3. At all times (When should we help people?)
4. We should be this to every Girl Scout (What is a sister?)
5. A better place (What do we want to make the world?)

Outdoor Skills

1. The number of dishpans needed for dishwashing at camp. (What is 3?)
2. Two types of knots. (What is overhand, square, etc.)
3. Something you always need to have near a fire to put it out. (What is a bucket of water?)
4. Something you use to help find your way in the wilderness (What is a compass?)
5. The best thing to do when lost (What is "stay where you are"?)

Girl Scouting Today

1. The largest voluntary organization for girls in the world (What is Girl Scouts?)
2. 5 through 17 (What are the ages for Girl Scouts?)
3. Over 3 million (How many Girl Scouts are there in the U.S.?)
4. The basic unit for group activities (What is a troop?)
5. Troops in a geographical area are organized into this larger unit. (What is a council, neighborhood or service unit?)

Our Council

1. The name of our council (What is Girl Scout Council of the Nation's Capital or GSCNC?)
2. The names of 3 of the counties in our council (9 total: What is Fairfax, Prince William, Loudoun, Montgomery, Charles, St Mary's, Calvert, Prince George's, Fauquier)

3. The name of two of our council's campsites (What is Crowell, Coles Trip, Potomac Woods, Aquasco, Winona or May Flather?)
4. The location of our council office (What is Washington, D.C.?)
5. One city that is in our council. (What is Alexandria, Fairfax, Springfield, Gaithersburg, Bethesda, McLean, etc.?) You wouldn't believe how hard this one was for them!!

2) We had different categories and here is an example: (Remember, all answers are to be in the form of a question??)

First Aid

Wash gently with soap and water. ?Treat a wound
 Press a gauze pad with your fingers and thumb. ? Stop Bleeding
 Pinch gently but firmly below bony part for 10 to 20 minutes. ?Stop a nosebleed.
 Providing more blood flow to the brain will prevent this. ?Fainting.
 Put in warm, loose clothing, cover with blanket, and heat gradually. ?Treating frostbite.
 Tiny, watery bumps break out when you touch this plant. ?Poison ivy
 Exposure to cold, wet & windy weather can cause this. ?Hypothermia
 Tensor, adhesive, and triangular. ?Types of bandages.
 A waterproof container with a tight-fitting lid. ?first aid kit
 Wear a hat with a brim to prevent this. ?Sunburn

Camping

Before leaving, make sure it's out. ?fire
 These two knots are used to hoist a flag. ?clove hitch and sheet bend
 This is a time for reflection at camp. ?Scout's Own
 This is the method for washing dishes at camp. ?1. Warm water and soap, 2.Hot water 3.Warm water & bleach
 We need these 3 things to start a fire. ?Fuel, heat, air
